<p>Famine - a widespread shortage of food often causing malnutrition, starvation and death.</p>	<p>The price of wheat on world markets rose 130% between March 2007 and March 2008.</p>	<p>Soil erosion - involves the removal of fertile top soil layers by wind and water. Causes include: overgrazing, growing crops, deforestation and the cultivation of marginal land.</p>
<p>Ethiopia alone loses one billion tonnes of topsoil every year.</p>	<p>In 2011 in Algeria the price of cooking oil doubled. This led to five days of rioting, with four people killed.</p>	<p>Undernutrition - is the lack of a balanced diet, and deficiency in vitamins and minerals.</p>
<p>Diets in sub-Saharan Africa are frequently deficient in protein, carbohydrates and fats. This is responsible for half of all child deaths.</p>	<p>Rising prices - food prices are rising mainly due to increased prices for fertilisers, animal feed, food storage, processing and transportation.</p>	<p>In the 1980's the famine in Ethiopia led to the death of an estimated 400000 people.</p>
<p>Occurs when a country can't supply enough food to feed its population.</p>	<p>Social unrest - sometimes called "food riots", correspond with the high rises in the price of food.</p>
