Uses for corners activity:

- This activity is called 'corners' and uses the corners of the classroom to determine students' opinions / views.
- It can also be used as a class builder to get students to accept theirs and others views more openly, without judgement.
- This is useful not only as a way of getting students to mix, but it may also be a way of identifying like-minded students with certain attitudes, values, opinions etc.
- It could also be a way of getting one student from each corner to mix with three from the other corners so that you have a mix of opinions or ideas.
- It can be used for variety of topics / themes, by just placing a picture, word or phrase in each corner and asking students to go to the one they relate with most.

Instructions for corners activity:

1. Teacher announces what the four corners are, or refers to the words, phrases or pictures which are in the corners, e.g. If you had a favourite season what would it be?
2. You may wish to get students to write down their choice first as this stops them choosing the same corner as a friend or the majority.
3. Get students to go to the corner they have chosen, ready to discuss/justify their reasons.
4. You could then get students to pairs up and discuss their shared view or group one person from each corner to discuss their differing views.
